Salaries

What did we do?

- June 30, 2015 Three CBAs expired:
 - Administrative Assistants
 - Custodians
 - Educational Support Professionals (ESPs)
- June 30, 2016 One CBA expired:
 - Teachers
- Two Years of Negotiations:
 - February 2015 March 2017

Salaries

• COLA

- Administrative Assistants:
 - 3.5% over 3 years
- Custodians:
 - 4.5% over 3 years
- Education Support Professionals:
 - 5% over 3 years

Salaries

- Teachers Unit
 - Largest and most costly
 - Most fiscally responsible and conservative negotiations in the last 10 years
 - **3** year contracts as high as 10% and as low as 5%
 - ERI 9 teachers retiring allow for turnover savings
 - New Agreement
 - 3.5% over 3 years
- Administrators held to same standard

Grading Key

Assumptions:

~200 students/grade (PK 70 students)

Educational Programming – The configurations of schools, in line with the District vision and best practice - includes general ed. programming and space requirements; special ed. programming, space requirements, and ADA accessibility; and adequate outdoor space. (*A=perfect fit; D=no substantive changes*)

Educational Interruption – (a) the number of students who will be displaced and the amount of time for which they will be displaced from current school while construction and renovation is occurring; and (b) interruption caused by construction occurring in or next to building being built or renovated, such as noise, temperature, restricted space... (A=none; D=whole school and/or 3+ years)

Swing Space Cost – Cost and logistical challenge to house students and programs in temporary spaces for the duration of new builds and renovations (*A=none; D=whole school/multiple years*)

School Project Costs – Cost of new building/significant renovations (A=least expensive ; D=most expensive)

Ongoing Capital Costs – This is money spent on continual major repair, replacement and updating of building systems to maintain current code and operating standard on all buildings in use, new and existing (*A=least amount; D=greatest amount*)

Operational Cost – Money spent on routine/scheduled maintenance and supplies to maintain proper operating systems including health, safety, security, climate, and utilities. (*A=least expensive; D= most expensive*)

Open Space Impact -The amount of open space and designated field space which is replicated on site or added (*A=gain; D=loss*)

Traffic/Neighborhood Impact – Temporary and long term disruptions, traffic and construction to neighborhood (*A=benefit to neighborhood*; *D=detrimental to neighborhood*)

MSBA Risk/Town Funding Risk – The funding risk for MSBA eligibility and Town approval for multi-phase project (*A=low risk; D=high risk*)

Timing – Time from the start of project until Hadley School is off-line (A= *immediately*; D= more than 5 years)

Current State

• Not acceptable:

- Dodging rain buckets
- Wearing winter coats or shorts
- Hallway instruction
- Cramped spaces
- Former closets turned into work spaces
- Limited natural light

Next Steps

While waiting to hear if we have been accepted into MSBA Program:

- Continue touring new construction in area districts (Lynn, Winthrop, Marblehead)
- Will begin public tours of our facilities with Boards, Committees, & Community
- Take the community through the work of the Task Force by way of forums
