

In addition to these requirements, students must earn qualifying scores on the English, Science, and Mathematics MCAS exams to receive a Swampscott High School diploma.

#### Minimum Graduation Requirements

Students must enroll in thirty (30) credits each year. A minimum of one hundred twenty (120) credits must be completed to qualify for a Swampscott High School diploma. **These credits must include the following:**





Cost: \$525 (less expensive than any other local driving program)





#### **SMS** students


The course selection process begins soon.
